Yankee Doodle Boy

The colorful and exciting 60-year musical career of Broadway giant, George M. Cohan, will come to life in the PJC production of "George M!"

Performances will be in the Ashmore Auditorium at 7:30 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays, Nov. 10, 11, 17 and 18. Matinee performances will be at 2:30 p.m. on Sundays, Nov. 12 and 19.

The show features 32 song and dance numbers guaranteed to keep the audience tapping their toes. One of Cohan's best known works, "Give My Regards to Broadway," captures the magic and joy of performing and is used prominently to set the theme of the play.

Born on the Fourth of July, 1878, Cohan was the original Yankee Doodle Boy. His work epitomized patriotism during World War II with such hits as "You're A Grand Old Flag," "Yankee Doodle Dandy" and "Over There."

From his first halting efforts as a hooper in his family's vaudeville act, Cohan seemed destined to make his mark on the American stage. As a young man, Cohan left vaudeville for the lights of Broadway and quickly gained recognition as a composer, performer and producer. His many contributions to Broadway musicals are still being enjoyed today.

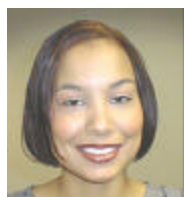

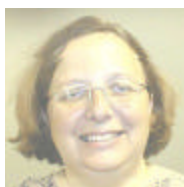

Outstanding New Faculty Member Nominations

Nomination forms for the 2000-2001 Outstanding New Faculty Member Award are available now in the academic departments, the Provost Office, and the Student Services Office on all campuses. The Outstanding New Faculty Member Award is given to a faculty member who is in the first three years as a full-time faculty member at the college and has demonstrated outstanding classroom instruction. Sabbatical Leave

Sabbatical leave is awarded to faculty members for the purpose of professional development or advancement and ultimately benefits the faculty member, the students and the college. Each year, the Board of Trustees awards a number of sabbatical leaves for the following academic year. Now is the time for faculty members to begin preparation of their sabbatical leave proposals. Faculty members who have completed seven full academic years of full-time service as a faculty member at PJC are eligible to apply for sabbatical leave. Eligibility criteria and application procedures are outlined in Article 14, Section 14.07 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

Annual Leave

All annual leave balances will be reduced to 330 hours on Jan. 1, 2001. No leave will be earned for the time period Dec. 9 through Dec. 22, 2000, since it will be the third payday of the month. If you have excess annual leave on the books, please plan accordingly.

Required Notice

Part II of Chapter 121, Florida Statutes, has created a new defined contribution pension plan which begins in 2002. The plan, named the Public Employee Optional Retirement Program (PEORP), will be part of the Florida Retirement System but will differ from the existing defined benefit plan. The State Board of Administration of Florida (SBA), as plan administrator of the new defined contribution plan, is requesting a determination from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) that the new plan is a qualified plan under Section 401(a) of the Square area from 10 a.m. to noon

Internal Revenue Code (and consequently will qualify for tax exempt treatment). The Division of Retirement, as plan administrator of the existing defined benefit plan, is also requesting a determination of the IRS that the defined benefit plan continues to be qualified under Code Section 401(a). A separate notice to interested parties must be given with respect to each of the two applications for an IRS determination letter so that interested parties are notified of their right to make comment, or cause comment to be made, with respect to whether the two plans meet the qualification requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. These notices may be read in the Learning Resources Centers on all three campuses and in the Human Resources office, building 7, Pensacola campus.
