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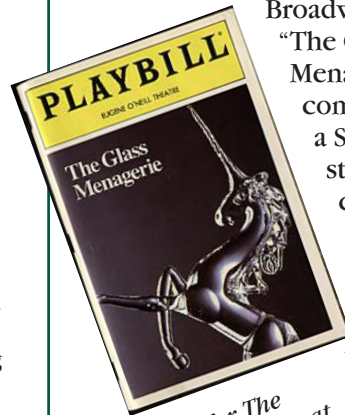

TENNESSEE WILLIAMS' THE GLASS MENAGERIE AT ASHMORE AUDITORIUM

The Pensacola Junior College Music and Theatre Department presents "The Glass Menagerie" on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 25, Feb. 26, March 4 and March 5 at 7:30 p.m. and Sundays, Feb. 27 and March 6 at 2:30 p.m. in the Ashmore Auditorium.

The first play to establish Tennessee Williams as a major new playwright and Broadway success, "The Glass Menagerie" is a compelling story of a St. Louis family struggling to cope with the harsh realities of the Great Depression and the bitter memories that haunt them.

Williams left a powerful mark on American theatre. At their best, his twenty-five full-length plays combined lyrical intensity, haunting loneliness, and hypnotic violence. He is widely considered the greatest Southern playwright and one of the greatest playwrights in the history of American drama.

Cast members include Laura Sebastian, a Florida Theatre Association grant recipient, playing Amanda; Lindsay Fennell playing Laura; Larry McHenry playing Tom; and Justin Chavers, another grant recipient, playing Jim. Director is Stan

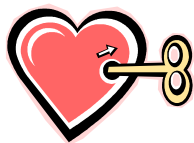

Sabbatical Leave

The Sabbatical Leave application period has been **re-opened** for two weeks for the purpose of accepting applications for one available sabbatical for 2005-2006. The sabbatical application may be for a term, a half-year or a full-year.

Sabbatical leave is awarded to faculty members for the purpose of professional development or advancement and ultimately benefits the faculty member, the students, and the college.

Faculty members who have completed seven full academic years of full-time service as a faculty member at PJC are eligible to apply for sabbatical leave. Eligibility criteria and application procedures are outlined in Article 14, Section 14.07 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

Environmental Safety Tips

Lead in drinking water can cause a variety of adverse health effects. Here are some actions you can take:

- Flush your pipes before drinking – anytime the water in a faucet has not been used for six hours or longer, “flush” your cold water pipes by running the water until it becomes as cold as possible.

- Only use cold water for consumption – hot water is likely to contain higher levels of lead. Most of the lead in household water usually comes from the plumbing in your house, not from the local water supply.

- Have your water tested – The only way to be sure of the amount of lead in your household water is to have it tested by a competent laboratory.
