Quite a buzz is stirring on campus about QEP. Do you know what it means?

QEP stands for Quality Enhancement Plan. The Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools requires all accredited colleges and universities to have a QEP — a five-year plan designed to improve student learning. SACS accredits colleges in 11 southeastern states, including Florida.

Why QEP...why now?

SACS is currently reviewing PJC's accreditation, and the QEP is part of the process.

What is Learning to Learn...Learning for Life?

This is Pensacola Junior College's QEP topic. It does *not* replace PJC's official positioning statement — "You can get there from here" — printed on PJC brochures, annual publications, advertisements and other college materials.

What is PJC's plan?

To design, implement, assess and evaluate strategies to help PJC students become effective, independent, life-long learners responsible for their own learning.

What is being done?

PJC has established several Learning to Learn...Learning for Life initiatives including multiple ways to help students (especially new students) succeed.

What's next?

The SACS on-site committee will visit PJC Oct. 9-11, 2007 to review our QEP and suggest ways to improve it.
